What is provided for us at each campsite/cabin?

Although each living unit (tents or cabins) is unique, each unit contains the following equipment: cast iron for cooking over the fire (dutch ovens and frying pans: one large and one small of each), one rake, one metal bucket, one broom, one shovel, fire extinguisher, three dish bins, one trash can, clearly posted directions to the nearest hospital, and clearly posted emergency weather procedures. Some cabins come equipped with everything in one building, including kitchens. Others have basic cots or mattresses for sleeping only (you cook over the campfire). Most of our tent units have flush toilets, but some have latrines so read the description for each unit closely! Be sure to bring basic cleaning supplies with you each visit (to wash dishes & wipe down appliances, and counters, and clean the bathrooms). Each unit has a posted Kaper chart for use when preparing for checkout at the end of your visit.

When do we submit our troop camping application?

Registration opens on April 1 each year for Troop Camping for the entire Girl Scout year (October through September). We now have online registration for Troop Camping. Check the live up-to-date availability before you register. Make sure to list the adult(s) who have completed the Troop Outdoor Certificate and First Aider/CPR trainings. Include all adults attending so that we may verify they are registered Girl Scouts and have a completed background check on file.

When are the units available?

Always double-check the online availability to see when units are available. Council staff host events on site and many weekends are reserved for these programs. Cabin units are open year-round. Platform tent camping availability at all camps begin the last weekend of March and end the weekend before Thanksgiving.

How accessible are the units for people who use a wheelchair or have limited mobility?

Accessibility is different at each camp and unit. Each campsite and many of the program areas are listed so that you can determine if the unit will meet the needs of everyone in your troop/group. Every effort is made to accommodate needs if we have prior knowledge. We cannot guarantee that every area of the camps is barrier-free or wheelchair accessible.

Troop Camping Confirmation and Arrival Information

You will receive an auto-reply confirmation with details after you successfully complete your online registration. This will include a form that must be completed and returned listing the names of all the girls and adults camping. It is due at least two weeks prior to your camping date. All payments are due 1 month prior to your camping date. You will receive a reminder notice via e-mail. One to two weeks before your troop camping weekend, the camp program coordinator will send you an electronic welcome packet requesting your arrival time and confirming your participant numbers. The camp site team stewards the girls' camps and eagerly awaits your arrival.

Dodd House Village - Overnight fee (1 or 2 nights) \$110.00 per cabin

Four cabins rented separately with 4 bunk beds with mattresses each cabin sleeps 8 people. Each cabin has heat and air conditioning and access to a table and 8 folding chairs upon request. Cabins share a central Lodge with meeting space with full bathrooms. Bathrooms include toilets, showers, toilet paper, hand soap, and paper towels. The kitchen is rented separately. Includes a fire ring and a box of supplies that contain a coffee pot, electric skillet, crockpot, and griddle to assist you in food prep. We will also provide you with a cooler outside your cabin for storing your cold food items if requested upon your request.

You can rent the entire unit by selecting each cabin and the kitchen upon registration.

No crafts containing glue, glitter, paint, wax, or tie-dye.

The general terrain is level and flat at the front with a hill at the back of the building. Entry into the front of the building is by concrete ramp – entry from the rear is by steps only. Access to the fire ring is limited due to the hilly, steep terrain at the back of the building. Parking is available for vehicles with a valid parking permit. Please contact the Camp Staff in advance to ensure access. Entry into the bathroom is flat. There is one accessible toilet stall with raised stool and grab bars. The shower stall is roll-in with grab bars, a shower seat, and a flexible shower head with a hose.
Dodd House Kitchen Weekend fee: \$50 Located in Lodge/meeting space area and includes a refrigerator, stove, pots, pans, dishes, utensils, garbage liners, coffee maker, and toaster – bring your own cleaning supplies. The kitchen is locked and only the troop renting it will have access.		

Gypsy Hill Village - Cabin Overnight Fee (1 or 2 nights) \$110 per cabin

Four cabins rented separately each has 4 bunk beds with mattresses and sleeps 8 people. Each cabin has heat and air conditioning. All cabins share an enclosed unit shelter with heat and air conditioning. The shelter includes tables and chairs, space for programming, and food prep with access to a refrigerator and kitchen sink for washing dishes. Shower and bathroom facilities are attached. The camp will provide toilet paper, paper towels, and hand soap. You must provide your own, heavy-duty garbage bags and cleaning supplies. You will have shared access to an open-sided unit shelter with a fire ring.

Each cabin will have a box of supplies that contain a coffee pot, electric skillet, crockpot, and griddle to assist you in food prep. We will also provide you with a cooler outside your cabin for storing your cold food items upon your request.

You can rent the entire unit by selecting each cabin upon registration.

The general terrain is level and flat. Additional assistance may be required by persons using a wheelchair for mobility to reach the unit shelter that has a two-inch step up; the fire ring is open and easy to access. Cabin 3 has a low ramp allowing easy wheelchair entry. Parking is available for vehicles with valid parking permits. Please contact the Camp Staff in advance to ensure access. Entry into the bathroom is flat. There is one accessible toilet stall with raised stool and grab bars. The shower stalls have grab bars and a flexible shower head with a hose with a raised lip entry that does not permit roll-in.

Tall Timbers – Platform Tent Overnight: Maximum 28 people Overnight Fee (1 or 2 nights) \$125 Firewood is provided.	Seven platform tents, four cots and mattresses in each. Open-sided unit shelter with shower and bathroom facilities, picnic tables, charcoal grill, unit equipment, electricity, water and fire ring. Camp will provide toilet paper, paper towels and hand soap. You must provide your own, heavy-duty garbage bags and cleaning supplies. Vehicle access to this unit is not possible. Please contact the camp staff in advance regarding parking.	Accessibility to this unit for a person using a wheelchair or with limited mobility would require assistance. Entrance into the unit is by a steep rugged trail. The general terrain is mostly hilly with exposed roots. The unit shelter has a small step up and the fire ring is accessible with flat access, but access to the fire ring area may require additional assistance. There is one tent in this unit with ramp access, however, the terrain approaching the tent is rugged with exposed roots. Entry into the bathroom is relatively flat. There is one accessible toilet stall with raised stool and grab bars. The shower stalls have grab bars and a flexible shower head with a hose with a raised lip entry that does not permit roll-in.
Pebblebrook – Platform Tent Overnight: Maximum 16 people Overnight Fee (1 or 2 nights) \$125 Firewood is provided.	Four platform tents, four cots, and mattresses in each. Open-sided unit shelter with shower and bathroom facilities, picnic tables, charcoal grill, unit equipment, electricity, water, and fire ring. The camp will provide toilet paper, paper towels, and hand soap. You must provide your own, heavy-duty garbage bags and cleaning supplies. Vehicle access to this unit is limited to the entry point at the top of the hill.	Accessibility to this unit for a person using a wheelchair or with limited mobility would require assistance. Entrance into the unit is by steep rugged trail. General terrain is mostly hilly and steep with exposed roots and rock. The unit shelter has a wheel in access and the fire ring is easily accessible and flat with roll-in entry though the ground surrounding it has loose soil and rocks. There is not a tent in this unit with ramp access. Entry into the bathroom is approximately one step onto the concrete porch. There is one accessible toilet stall with a raised stool and grab bars. The shower stalls have grab bars, a flexible shower head with hose, and a raised lip entry that does not permit roll-in.

Open-sided unit shelter with shower and bathroom facilities, picnic tables, charcoal grill, unit equipment, electricity, water, and fire ring. The camp will provide toilet paper, paper towels, and hand soap. You must provide your own, heavy-duty garbage bags and cleaning supplies. Vehicle access to this unit is limited to the entry point at the bottom of the hill.	Accessibility to this unit for a person using a wheelchair or with limited mobility would require assistance. Entrance into the unit is by steep rugged trail; the general terrain is mostly hilly and steep with exposed roots and rock; the unit shelter has wheel in access and the fire ring is easily accessible and flat with roll-in entry, however, the ground surrounding it has loose soil and rocks. There is one tent in this unit with ramp access. Entry into the bathroom is approximately one step onto the concrete porch. There is one accessible toilet stall with raised stool and grab bars. The shower stalls have grab bars and a flexible shower head with a hose with a raised lip entry that does not permit roll-in .
Tree Tops – Hammock Camping Overnight: Maximum 25 people 12 people in Hammock – 4 people in Platform Tent – 9 people bring your own tent Overnight Fee (1 or 2 nights) \$125 Firewood is not provided.	One platform tent with four cots and mattresses. Four platforms with space for 3 hammocks. Bring your own tent 2-3 tents max 9 people. Open-sided unit shelter with picnic tables, charcoal grill, unit equipment, electricity, latrines, water, and fire ring. There are no shower facilities available at this unit. Unit shelter, power outlets, and latrines are lit by solar power. Limit your use of power-supplied items. You must provide your own toilet paper, paper towels, hand soap, heavy-duty garbage bags, and cleaning supplies. There is limited parking at this unit. Please contact the camp staff in advance to ensure access.	Accessibility to this unit for a person using a wheelchair or with limited mobility would require assistance. The entrance into the unit is steep, hilly, and rugged. The general terrain at the unit is gently sloping and flat in some areas. The unit shelter fire ring has wheel in access. There is no tent in this unit with ramp access. This unit has a latrine that is accessible to a person using a wheelchair, however, the terrain approaching the latrine would be difficult to navigate for a person with mobility restrictions and there is a slight step into the building. There is an accessible stall with grab bars. There are no shower facilities available at this unit.

This building is largely accessible to a person using a wheelchair or with limited mobility. The general terrain is mostly level and flat for entry purposes. Parking is available close by and access to the front of the building is on a paved road and path. Entry into the accessible bathroom is flat and there is one toilet with raised stool and grab bars.
