

Emergency Preparedness Kit Scavenger Hunt

1. This will help relieve minor aches and pains.
2. Very useful in case of an injury. These can help with cuts to keep dirt out.
3. Something to keep your hands clean
4. You'll need this to hold a bandage onto a wound.
5. Can be used under your tongue or under your arm
6. Something to sanitize wounds
7. This has a weave and can be in a roll or different sizes.
8. Something to sanitize personal items
9. Use this to apply antibiotic ointment/cream.
10. Something to cut bandages and gauze
11. To pick up objects that your fingers can't, you will need these.
12. You will need this to make a cold compress.
13. Something to protect your hands
14. Have this on hand for protection from the cold or in case of shock.
15. Commonly used for sprains
16. You will want this if the lights go out, or it gets dark and you need some extra light.
17. Without this you can't survive long, so make sure there's enough in your kit.
18. If you need to clean or refresh your eyes, use these.
19. This helps relieve coughs.
20. You will want this if you burn yourself to help soothe the pain.
21. Something to soothe insect bites or stings
22. When the power is out, you will need these as a power supply.
23. Have one of these around to make some sound if you're lost after a disaster. Don't rely on your cell phone.
24. No chance to use ATM's if electricity is out, so stash some of this in the kit.
25. Have these on hand in case the situation becomes dire.

1. Aspirin/ibuprofen
2. Adhesive bandages
3. Hand sanitizer/sanitizing wipes/soap
4. Roll of adhesive tape
5. Thermometer
6. Antibiotic ointment
7. Gauze pad
8. Alcohol (at least 60%) /alcohol wipes
9. Cotton swab
10. Scissors
11. Tweezers
12. Ice pack
13. Plastic gloves
14. Emergency blanket
15. ACE bandage/elastic bandage
16. Flashlight
17. Bottled water
18. Eye drops
19. Cough medicine
20. Aloe Vera gel
21. Calamine lotion/antihistamines
22. Extra batteries
23. Whistle
24. Cash
25. Candles and matches
