Questions About Adult Awards

Who can nominate?

Anyone can nominate! Girls, volunteers, staff, neighbors – anyone who recognizes a job well done can nominate an adult, business or organization for an adult award.

Who can be nominated?

For most awards, nominees must:

- Be actively registered Girl Scout members
- Be an approved volunteer with a current background check on file
- Have completed at least one term of service in their volunteer position
- Understand and practice inclusive behavior as one of the key values of Girl Scouting
- Provide service above and beyond the requirements of their position

What about parents or community members who are not Girl Scouts?

We offer two special recognitions for these ‘friends of Girl Scouts.’

- The Extra Mile Certificate recognizes any member of the community whose contribution goes above and beyond in support of Girl Scouts and our mission and goals.
- The Special Supporter Certificate recognizes a business or organization that provides a benefit or service in support of Girl Scouts and our mission and goals.

How do I nominate someone?

Use the online form on our website, www.gsgatl.org (For Volunteers > Volunteer Recognitions).

You’ll need to gather some contact information, for the person you are nominating and for other volunteers we can talk to about the nomination. Once you have this information together, the form should only take about 15-20 minutes.

Is there a deadline?

Awards which require approval by the Board of Directors have spring and fall deadlines based on the Board meeting schedule. For other awards we request a 60-day processing time to allow for pins and certificates to be prepared and shipped. Check out the chart on page 4 for details.

- For spring presentations, we recommend you submit your nominations by February 15.
- For fall/winter award ceremonies, we recommend you submit your nomination by September 15.

How do I know if and when they will receive the award?

The Volunteer Experience team reviews each nomination carefully to make sure your nominee receives the right award. If we have any questions we will contact you directly for more information. Some awards need to be presented to our Board of Directors for approval, and this may take a few weeks, so please be patient! You can always reach out to us on the Volunteer Helpline if you have questions (1-800-771-1139).

When the award is approved, we will notify you, the nominator, by email – that way if the award is a surprise we won't spoil it! Certificates and pins will be mailed to you or to whomever you list on the nomination form.

How does the council recognize award-winning volunteers?

Girl Scout volunteers who are awarded any of our adult recognitions are honored at special council events during the Girl Scout year, and will be listed on our website (with their permission, of course).

How do I choose the right award?

Each award recognizes different achievements and the different impacts that a volunteer's service might have. All awards recognize a volunteer's contributions in supporting the mission and strategic goals of the council and the Girl Scout movement. The chart below may help you decide on the best award for your volunteer, but you can also feel free to call our Volunteer Helpline for further assistance.

National awards (listed in bold) may be worn on the official Girl Scout adult uniform. Awards marked with an asterisk (*) require the approval of the Board of Directors. Council awards (listed in regular type) are approved by Volunteer Support staff and may be worn informally for any occasion.

Volunteer of Excellence	Any Girl Scout volunteer member	Outstanding service in delivering the Girl Scout Leadership Experience in partnership with girls, or outstanding service in support of the council's mission delivery to adult members.	6 weeks prior to presentation
Appreciation Pin*	Any Girl Scout volunteer member	Outstanding service to help a single service unit or geographic area reach and surpass its mission-delivery goals	Spring – Feb 15 Fall – Sep 15
Honor Pin*	Any Girl Scout volunteer member	Outstanding service to help more than one service unit or geographic area reach and surpass their mission-delivery goals	Spring – Feb 15 Fall – Sep 15
Thanks Badge*	Any Girl Scout volunteer member	Ongoing commitment, leadership and service which has an exceptional, measurable impact on the mission-delivery goals of the entire council or the entire Girl Scout movement.	Spring – Feb 15 Fall – Sep 15
Thanks Badge II*	Any Girl Scout volunteer member who has received the Thanks Badge	Ongoing commitment, leadership and service which has an exceptional, measurable impact on the mission-delivery goals of the entire council or the entire Girl Scout movement.	Spring – Feb 15 Fall – Sep 15
President's Award*	Any Girl Scout service team	Exemplary service in support of mission delivery, surpassing team goals and resulting in significant, measurable impact toward reaching overall council goals.	October 15
Extra Mile Certificate	Any non-member adult	Consistent support of the council's programs and policies; service that goes above and beyond, exemplifying Girl Scout values	6 weeks prior to presentation
Special Supporter Certificate	Any business or organization	Service that benefits a troop or service unit while increasing visibility of Girl Scouting in the local community	6 weeks prior to presentation
Fantastic Family	Any Girl Scout volunteer family	At least three family members have worked together to support one or more activities for a service unit. At least one family member holds a leadership role in the service unit	6 weeks prior to presentation
Pioneer Pin	Any Girl Scout volunteer member having seven or more years of service	Outstanding service in any capacity (or multiple capacities) for at least seven years , participating in training as necessary to update knowledge	6 weeks prior to presentation
Helen Foster Pin	Any Girl Scout volunteer member	Outstanding service to two or more service units in multiple capacities over time.	6 weeks prior to presentation
