What is provided for us at each campsite/cabin?

Although each living unit (tents or cabins) is unique, you can expect to find certain unit equipment in every unit which includes: cast iron for cooking over the fire (one large and one small each dutch oven and frying pans); one rake, metal bucket and broom; one-two shovels; fire extinguisher; three dish pans; one trash can; clearly posted directions to the nearest hospital and clearly posted emergency weather procedures. Some cabins come equipped with almost everything you need for your weekend including kitchens. Others have basic cots or mattresses for sleeping only (you cook over the campfire). Most of our tent units have flush toilets, but some have latrines so read the description for each unit closely! Be sure to bring basic cleaning supplies with you each visit (to wash dishes, wipe down appliances and counters and to clean the bathrooms). Each unit has a posted Kaper chart for use when preparing for check out at the end of your visit.

When do we submit our troop camping application?

Check the <u>website</u> for when registration opens for Troop Camping for the entire Girl Scout year (October through September). Registration is online for Troop Camping. Check the live up-to-date availability before you register. Make sure to list the adult(s) who have completed the Troop Outdoor Certificate and First Aider/CPR trainings. Include all adults attending so that we may verify they are registered Girl Scouts and have a completed background check on file.

When are the units available?

Always double check the online availability to see when units are available. Council staff host events on site and many weekends are reserved for these programs. Cabin units are open year-round. Platform tent camping at all camps begins the last weekend of March at Misty Mountain and begins the second weekend of March at Timber Ridge and ends the weekend before Thanksgiving.

How accessible are the units for people who use a wheelchair or have limited mobility?

Accessibility is different at each camp and unit. Each campsite and many of the program areas are listed by camp and campsite so that you can determine if the unit will meet the needs of everyone in your troop/group. Every effort is made to accommodate needs if we have prior knowledge of the need, however we cannot guarantee that every area of the camps is barrier free or wheelchair accessible.

Troop Camping Confirmation and Arrival Information

You will receive an auto-reply receipt/confirmation with details after you successfully complete your online registration. This will include a link to a form that must be completed and returned listing all the names of all the girls and adults camping. It is due at least two weeks prior to your camping date. All payments are due 1 month prior to your camping date. You will receive a reminder notice. One to two weeks before your troop camping weekend, the camp program coordinator will send you an electronic welcome packet to camp requesting your arrival time and confirming your participant numbers. The camp site team stewards the girls' camps and eagerly awaits your arrival.

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Dodd House Village - Overnight fee (1 or 2 nights) \$110.00 per cabin

Four cabins rented separately with 4 bunk beds with mattresses each cabin sleeps 8 people. Each cabin has heat and air conditioning. Cabins share a central Lodge via boardwalks that has meeting space with full bathrooms. Bathrooms include toilets, showers, toilet paper, hand soap, and paper towels and cleaning supplies. Each cabin includes access to a fire ring, firewood and a unit cookout box. The kitchen is rented separately.

You can rent the entire unit by selecting each cabin and the kitchen upon registration.

No crafts containing glue, glitter, paint, wax or tie-dye.

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Gypsy Hill Village - Cabin Overnight Fee (1 or 2 nights): \$110 per cabin

Four cabins rented separately each has 4 bunk beds with mattresses and sleeps 8 people. Each cabin has heat and air conditioning. All cabins share an enclosed unit shelter with heat and air conditioning. The shelter includes tables and chairs, space for programming, and food prep with access to a refrigerator and kitchen sink for washing dishes. Shower and bathroom facilities are attached to the shelter. The camp will provide toilet paper, paper towels, hand soap, heavy-duty garbage bags and cleaning supplies. You will have shared access to an open-sided unit shelter with a fire ring.

Each cabin includes firewood, and a unit cookout box that has a coffee pot, electric skillet, crockpot and griddle to assist you in food prep.

You can rent the entire unit by selecting each cabin upon registration.

Bathrooms located in the program building are shared with all cabins and include toilets, showers, toilet paper, hand soap and paper towels. No indoor cooking, unless kitchen is rented. Fire ring and a box of supplies that contain a coffee pot, electric skillet, crock pot and griddle to assist you in food prep. We will also provide you a cooler outside your cabin for storing your cold food items.

Firewood is provided.

You can rent the entire unit by selecting each cabin and the kitchen upon registration.

By doing this you would also have access to the leader's room that sleeps 4.

Magnolia View - Screened-In Cabin

Magnolia View is made up of two screened cabin units. Each unit has access to their own fire ring, picnic tables and sources for potable water. Full bathroom includes flush toilets, showers, toilet paper, hand soap and paper towels. Side A has access to a one-sided pavilion as a main gathering place. Restrooms and shower house do not support female and male mixed group overnights.

You can rent the entire unit by selecting each cabin upon registration.

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Magnolia View A Overnight maximum: \$100 Overnight Fee (1 or 2 nights): 12 One large screened-in bunkhouse-style cabin with 6 bunk beds. Accessibility to this unit for a person using a wheelchair or with limited mobility would require assistance. The general terrain is mostly hilly and steep. There is not a cabin in this unit with ramp access. This unit is relatively far from a parking lot but with hilly access to the unit. Entry into the bathroom is flat.
