Our camps spark confidence and joy in the girls who attend. We call it "camp magic."

Camp is transformative. When a girl leaves home and enters the world of camp, she grows by learning new skills and becomes stronger and happier by making new friends. Our trained and caring staff members support girls ages 5–17 in discovering who they are and who they can become. Our engaging programs and activities are designed with girls' interests in mind so they can grow their passions and take healthy risks in a safe, supportive environment. At Girl Scout Camp, we expect everyone to always respect and treat each other with dignity, honesty, and compassion.



Is My Girl Ready for Sleepaway Camp?

We share your desire to find the best experience possible for your camper, and for this reason, we offer a rich progression of sessions. You can choose from a variety of options such as day camp, day camp with overnight options, and traditional week-long and multi-week overnight sessions.

While Girl Scout Camp has something for every level of readiness, there are some skills and abilities that signal whether a sleepaway camp is right for your Girl Scout. We've created a simple guide for parents who are trying to select an appropriate program for their camper. You can find the guide and more details about each camp session at girlscoutsummer.com. If you and your camper decide she's not ready for a full week of sleepaway camp, consider the day camp sessions with an optional overnight experience at Camp Timber Ridge.

Leadership in the Outdoors

Girls dive into a whole new world of activities at Girl Scout Camp from archery to cooking over a camp fire, but they can also strengthen their skills and grow their passion for environmental stewardship through our outdoor leadership programming. All three of our Girl Scout Summer Camps provide a progressive leadership program that gives your camper the skills, experiences, and opportunities to let their leadership shine.

Counselor-in-Training I (CIT I) is a two-week experience for girls entering grades 9–11. CIT I camp is an intensive introduction to youth development, counseling, teaching, and leadership skills. At CIT I with horses (available at Camp Meriwether and Camp Misty Mountain), the girls participate in all the above programs and spend time daily at the barn learning horsemanship and taking riding lessons. There is also Guard-in-Training (GIT 1 with Aquatics) at Camp Misty Mountain for those interested in gaining lifeguard experience in addition to the leadership training.

Counselor-in-Training II (CIT II) is the natural progression for those who were successful in the CIT I experience. This two-week program is for girls entering grades 11-12. CIT II has a strong focus on knowledge and practical experience in the critical areas of team dynamics, project management, leadership when working with peers and younger campers, and training in a specialty program area. The Wrangler-in-Training (WIT)/CIT II program (available at Camp Meriwether and Camp Misty Mountain) is for girls who have completed CIT I with horses and are ready to learn how to plan, teach, and evaluate beginner horseback riding lessons at camp, as well as increase their own horsemanship and riding skills daily at the barn. For campers that have completed GIT 1, they can return to Camp Misty Mountain for continued lifeguard training with GIT 2.





Camp Meriwether – Unleash Your Curiosity, Creativity & Courage!

Located 50 miles southwest of Metro Atlanta in Luthersville, Camp Meriwether's cozy 270 acres of rolling hills, shady woods, and open fields offers a wide variety of classic camp activities. Saddle up with our English equestrian program for beginning to advanced riders, perform on stage, stay cool kayaking and paddle boarding, or take aim on the archery range. Meriwether will become your camper's "home" during their stay. Girls can spend summer their way! Camp Meriwether is open to grades 2–12, including Girl Scouts who are Brownies, Juniors, Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors. Grades for summer camp are based on a camper's fall 2023 school grade.

How to Register for Camps

General Registration opens December 1, 2022. Registering is easy!

- 1. Visit *GirlScoutSummer.com* and use our Find a Camp tool to review descriptions of our camp sessions and dates.
- **2.** Choose the session and dates that work best for you.
- **3.** Click register. Before you head over to our camp registration, a few FAQs will appear.
- **4.** Start your camper application and complete your registration.
- **5.** Once your application is complete and you have paid the deposit, you will receive an email confirmation. Check your spam folder if needed. All forms and documents must be turned in 30 days prior to the start of camp.

Payments Are Easy!

- 1. Non-refundable deposits are due per camp session at the time of registration. Day camp sessions have a \$50 deposit per session. Sleepaway sessions have a \$100 deposit per session.
- 2. A one-time, non-refundable registration fee of \$50 per camper will be added to each camper's record. You receive a free t-shirt and patch for the first camp your child attends. This must be paid when registering even though you paid your deposit.
- 3. If you are not a current Girl Scout, you must register and pay the annual \$25 membership dues (2022-23). You can add this as an additional option when registering for camp.
- 4. The remaining balance is due May 1 for all camp sessions in June and July or your registration is subject to cancellation. Payments can be made monthly with no interest!



Buddies at Camp

Campers are welcome to sign up for camp with a friend within one grade of each other and attending the same camp program. If camp buddies are in different grades such as 5th and 6th grades, the older girl will be placed in the younger camper's age group. Make sure to list your buddy's first and last name when completing your registration. Changes cannot be made at camp check-in. Buddy request changes can be made by updating the application or by contacting *camp@gsgatl.org*. Changes should be made no later than two weeks prior to your camper's session.

The Girl Scout Cookie Program Helps Girls Pay for Camp

To redeem your cookie dough for summer camp, follow the instructions to submit cookie dough payment online *via the form* as instructed in your reward email. If you would like to use cookie dough as



payment for your deposit, email us at *camp@gsgatl.org* after you have submitted your cookie dough payment through the form online so that we can make your camp registration active.

Changes, Cancellations & Refunds

To make a change to your camper's session, please contact the Operations Coordinators at *camp@gsgatl.org* Changes are made based on availability.

Cancellations must be submitted via email to *camp@gsgatl.org* no later than 30 days before the start date of your camper's session to receive a refund less the deposit and registration fee. All deposits and registration fees are non-refundable. The deposit for one-week and two-week overnight sessions is \$100, the deposit for day camp sessions is \$50. The registration fee of \$50 and the Girl Scout Membership fee is non-refundable.

In the event of illness or the death of an immediate family member, a refund less the deposit and registration fee and membership fee is available with a doctor's note or documentation. Documents must be received no later September 1, 2023.
